### Who are we?

The Royal Society of Blind Children (RSBC) works with a National Network of Partner Organisations to deliver relevant and personalised services to Blind and Partially sighted young people in England and Wales.



### Aiming higher for children and young people:

discriminatory attitudes and behaviours within society.

### The Qualification:

Participation in the Capacity Building Training will enable you to access the opportunity for a formal accredited qualification in Youth Work and working with vision impaired (VI) Young People.

### Is the training for me?

This course is for anyone delivering services for children and young people. You might be a youth worker, volunteer, a young person, or anyone with a role working directly with children and young people.



### **What is the training about?**

This training is a free, interactive, online, three-hour training course where you will gain the knowledge and confidence to include blind and partially sighted children and young people in your

provision. These organisations include local youth clubs, activities, sports sessions, or any other activity that welcomes children and young people to your provision.

### **What will I learn?**

You'll learn about common eye conditions, their impact on the individual, and explore the myths around sight loss. You'll gain essential guidance on making your clubs, activities, and sessions VI friendly. There will be an opportunity to gain a practical understanding of adapting virtual and physical activities to make them inclusive to children and young people with sight loss.
